ABSTRACT

Ayurveda is an art and science of life. Ayurveda explains many principles for the maintains of health and treatment of the diseases one of them is shatkriyakala. Kriyakala is the process of understanding the pathogenesis of disease in consecutive stages. These six are also the stages of chikitsa. If vyadhi is treated in first stage it won't convert into next stage. In this present article "Conceptual Review On Shatkriyakala In Ayurveda" is elaborated.

INTRODUCTION

Kriyakala is the process of understanding the pathogenesis of disease in consecutive stages. Six stages were described for successive manifestation of the disease, namely *sanchaya*, *prakopa*, *prasara*, *sthanasanshraya*, *vyakti* and *bheda*.

These six are also the stages of *chikitsa*. If *vyadhi* is treated in first stage it won't convert into next stage.

Intention of this article is to shed light on concept of *shatkriyakala* according to *Ayurveda*.

Aim and objective: To study the concept of *shatkriyakala*.

DISCUSSION

Kriyakala is the process of understanding the pathogenesis of disease in consecutive stages. Six stages were described for successive manifestation of the disease, namely *sanchaya*, *prakopa*, *prasara*, *sthanasanshraya*, *vyakti* and *bheda*. [1]

These six are also the stages of *chikitsa*. If *vyadhi* is treated in first stage it won't convert into next stage.

If accumulated *doshas* has been eliminated it won't manifest successive stages of *kriyakala*. If not eliminated, it passes to next stages. As the disease advances to latter stage it becomes stronger and stronger for management.^[2]

Sanchaya

Gradual accumulation of *doshas* in respective seat is called as *sanchaya*. It is the first stage of kriyakala.^[3,4,5]

Causes

- According to season
- > According to age
- Asatmya indriya artha sanyoga
- > Pradnaparadha

Symptoms

- ➤ Vatasanchaya^[6]:stiffness and fullness in abdomen
- ➤ Pittasanchaya^[7]yellowish discoloration of body parts, mild increase in body temperature
- ightharpoonup Kaphasanchaya^[8] heaviness in the whole body, lassitude

Treatment

Person develops aversion towards the causative factor which is responsible for accumulation of doshas.^[9]

Doshas should be treated in *chaya* awastha. If all the *doshas* are vitiated, then powerful *dosha* should be treated first without disturbing the other *doshas*. [10]

Prakopa

This is the second stage of kriyakala and also second stage for chikitsa.

When Accumulated *doshas* completely fills the *swa* – *staha* / *aashaya*, it is called as prakopa.^[11]

According to ashtang hrudayaprakopa is, accumulated doshas moving to other sites other than its main site. But this is prasar awastha according to aacharya sushrut. [12]

Causes^[13]

- Swabhavika / chaya purvaka
- Eg. Varsha rutu vataprakopa
- Sharad rutu pittaprakopa
- Vasant rutu kaphaprakopa
- aswabhavika / achaya purvaka
- Eg. Shrama vataprakopa
- Krodha pittaprakopa
- Diwaswapa kaphaprakopa

Symptoms

- *Vataprakopa*^[14]:pricking type of pain and movement of *vata* in *maha srotas*.
- *Pittaprakopa*^[15]:sour eructation's, excess thirst and burning sensation all over the body
- Kaphaprakopa^[16]: aversion to food, excess salivation in mouth.

Treatment

Treat the vitiated dosha.

Prasara

In this stage overflowing of doshas from their respective seats to other places takes place.

Main factor for movement is *vayu* because of being mobile in nature. [17]

Doshasmoves to different places with the help of vayu either alone or in combination.

Symptoms

Vataprasara^[19]

- > vata moves to different places other than its own seat
- painful sensation in *maha srotas*pittaprasara^[20]: localised burning sensation
- > sucking type of pain
- burning sensation all over the body
- > emitting smoke from the mouth kaphaprasara^[21]: anorexia
- > indigestion
- > lassitude
- vomiting

Treatment^[22]

Treat the causative factor as well as symptoms.

Sthanasanshraya

Vitiated *doshas* spread to different places and struck somewhere because of obstruction in *strotas* due to abnormality in *strotas* is called sthanasanshraya. [23,24]

In this stage of kriyakala, prodromal sign and symptoms of the disease are seen. [25]

When vitiated *doshas* spread in the body they produce specific disease according to particular site where *dosha – dushyasammurchana* takes place.^[26]

- Doshadushyasammurchana in Medhra manifest in following disease: Nirudha Prakash, Upadamsha, Shuka Dosha
- > Doshadushyasammurchana in Guda manifest in following disease: Bhagandara, Arsha
- > Doshadushyasammurchana in Vrushana manifest in following disease: Vruddhi
- Doshadushyasammurchana in Urdhwa Jatrumanifest in following disease: Urdhwa Jatrugata Vikara
- Doshadushyasammurchana in Twak, Mamsaand Sandhi manifest in following disease: Kushtha, Visarpa
- Doshadushyasammurchana in Meda manifest in following disease: Granthi, Apache, Alaji, Arbuda, Galaganda
- Doshadushyasammurchana in Asthi manifest in following disease: Asthi Vidradhi

Treatment^[28]

Treat the vitiated *dosha*, *dushya* or both.

Vyakti

Appearance of clear cut symptoms of a disease is called vyakti stage. Cardinal sign and symptoms of the disease are expressed in this stage. We can diagnose particular disease from these sign and symptoms. [29]

Eg

Sharir Santapa: Jwara

Drava Mala Pravrutti: Atisara

Twacha – Netra Pitata: Kamala

Treatment^[30]

Vyadhi Pratyanika Chikitsa is advised in this stage.

Bheda

In case of *vrana* they burst and ulcer develops. This stage is called *bhedaawastha*.

In case of *jwara*, *atisara* etc. diseases if they are not treated in early stage they become chronic. And this chronic stage is called as *bhedaawastha*.^[31]

Treatment

This stage of manifestation is very difficult to cure and if not treated at the earliest stage, disease may become incurable.
