CRITICAL REVIEW OF AMRUTADI GUGGUL WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO BHARAT BHAISHAJYA RATNAKARA

ABSTRACT

Ayurveda is the ancient science of healing whose medicine formulations while being thousands of years old are relevant and useful even today. Rasashastra and Bhaishajyakalpana is the branch of Ayurveda which deals with herbomineral and herbal medicine formulations, respectively. Amrutadi Guggul is an herbal formulation which is mentioned in Ayurvedic classical texts and in useful in the treatment of Kushtha, Vatarakta, Vrana, etc. depending on the reference used to prepare the medicine. While a lot of Amrutadi Guggul formulations are available in the market it is important to identify and study all formulations and review which formulation suits which disease condition better. The present study is an attempt to collect and study various references of Amrutadi Guggul mentioned in Bharat Bhaishajya Ratnakar.

INTRODUCTION

Ayurveda is often described as the 'Science of Longevity' as it describes maintenance of health along with treatment of various diseases. For both these purposes, among other treatment forms, Ayurveda uses various medicine formulations; and the branch of Ayurveda

that primarily deals with the preparation of these formulation is Rasashastra and Bhaishajyakalpana. Of which Rasashastra deals with herbomineral and mineral formulations and Bhaishajyakalpana deals with herbal formulations. In Bhaishajyakalpana, Guggul Kalpana is mentioned in which, primarily Guggul i.e. *Commiphora mukula* is used along with other components. Amrutadi Guggul is one such formulation which is indicated for various diseases like Vatarakta, Kushtha, Vrana, etc. It is found in many classical texts and while there is some variation in its constituents, there is certain similarity too. The present study is an attempt to collect and study various references of Amrutadi Guggul.

AIM

The present study is aimed at collecting and compiling all references of Amrutadi Guggul from available text and studying them comparatively; focusing on their composition, method of preparation and indication

OBJECTIVES

- 1) To study Amrutadi Guggul as per Bharat Bhaishajya Ratnakar.
- 2) To compare Amrutadi Guggul as per various references from Bharat Bhaishajya Ratnakar.

MATERIALS AND METHODS

For the present literature study of Amrutadi Guggul text of Bharat Bhaishajya Ratnakar, Bhaishajya Ratnavali, Bhavprakash Nighantu, Rasa Ratnakar, Ayurvedic journals were studied

- A) Preparation of Amrutadi Guggul^[1]
- 1) First pathabheda

Guduchi 1 Part, Ela 2 Parts, Vidanga 3 Parts, Vatsak 4 Parts, Indrayava 5 Parts, Haritaki 6 Parts, Amalaki 7 Parts and Guggul 8 Parts Churna is taken and mixed together. It is consumed with Honey to cure Pidika, Sthoulya and Bhagandara.

2) Second pathabheda

Guduchi 100 Pala, Dashmoola 100 Pala, Patha, Murva, Vala, Kutaki, Daruharidra, Erandamoola each 10 Pala, Bibhitaki 100 pala, Haritaki 200 Pala and Amalaki 100 Pala is added to 192 Pala of water and heated and reduced to 1/8th and 16 Pala of Shuddha Guggul is added to it and 8 Pala of Ghrita is added to it and heated again till siddhi lakshana are seen. After stopping heat Guduchi satva, Shunthi, Pippali are added 2 Pala each and mixed properly. This when consumed can destroy all 18 Kushtha, Vatarakta, Kamala, Amavata,

Mandagni, Bhagandara, Peenas, Pratishyaya, Pleeha and Udar roga.

3) Third Pathabheda

Guduchi 1 Prastha, Shuddha Guggul, Amalaki, Bibhitaki, Haritaki in ½ Prastha each are added to 32 Prastha of water and heated until it reduces to 1/4th. After that heat is stopped and it is strained and heated again until it densifies. When it reaches ghana consistency, Danti, Trikuta, Vidanga, Guduchi, Triphala and Dalchini are added ½ pala each and mixed along with 1/4th Pala of Trivruta. When consumed in dose of 1 Karsha, it is used in treatment of Vatarakta, Kushtha, Dushta vrana, Prameha, Aamvata, Bhagandara, Nadivrana, Adhyavata.

4) Fourth Pathabheda

Guduchi 3 Prastha, Guggul 1 Prastha, Haritaki, Bibhitaki, Amalaki and Punarnava each 1 Prastha is crushed and added to 32 Prastha of Water and reduced to $1/4^{th}$ and filtered and heated again until it becomes Ghana. Then, churna of Danti, Chitrakmoola, Shunthi, Pippali, Triphala, Guduchi, Dalchini, Vidanga each ½ Pala and Trivruta $1/4^{th}$ Pala is added. It is used in treatment of Vatarakta, Kushtha, Dushta vrana, Prameha, Aamvata, Bhagandara, Nadivrana, Adhyavata but especially in Amlapitta.

5) Fifth Pathabheda

Guggul is added to Kwath of Triphala and Guduchi mixed together and consumed as treatment of Kroshtrusheersha.

6) Sixth Pathabheda

Guduchi, Bark of Patol, Triphala, Tricatu and vidanga are taken in equal parts and Guggul in the same quantity as rest all drugs and mixed. It is used in Vrana, Vatarakta, Gulma, Shoth and Pandu.

DISCUSSION

Amrutadi Guggul is an important formulation commonly used in the treatment of Vatarakta and Kushtha. Most of the contents are Ushna veerya and thus would help in reducing Vata. At the same time, Kushthahara Dravya are also present, thus making it useful in Kushtha. Laghu and Ruksha guna will help to pacify Kaphaj samprapti in Kushtha. Deepana and Pachana Guna will help in reducing Ama in both Amavata and Kushtha. The second Pathabheda is a

ghrita formulation which can be used in vyadhi with Vata-Pittaj predominancy. The fifth pathbheda is completely different from the rest 5 in the sense that it is individually indicated in Kroshtrusheersha. The review of pathabheda of Amrutadi Guggul has been done; but to prove the efficacy and safety of this combination advance research should be done like preparation, standardization, clinical trials, etc to better understand it.

CONCLUSION

From the literature review of Amrutadi Guggul mentioned in Bharat Bhaishajya Ratnakar we can get a clear idea of action of the formulation in this specific disease. This review also helps to understand different permutations and combinations of dravya mentioned in all six pathabheda and how it changes the Rogadhikar of the formulation. And even though there are certain similarities in the constituents, method of preparation as well as indications of Amruatdi Guggul as per various references, there are also differences in the proportions of the constituents. So, different pathbheda of Amrutadi Guggul need should be used considering the Dosha-Dushya Pradhanyata of the patient.
