A REVIEW ON VARIOUS HEMAGARBH POTTALI RASA IN AYURVEDIC CLASSICS

ABSTRACT

Introduction: Rasaushadhi are integral part of Ayurveda, and describes the use of metals and minerals for chronic disorders in various combinations, dosage forms. In Rasashastra four types of Rasakalpa are described i.e. Khalviya kalpana, Parpati kalpana, Kupipakwa rasayana and Pottali kalpana. Pottali Kalpana is a consolidated form of mercurial preparation, which incorporates the Pota Bandha of Parada. Thus, reviewing Hemagarbha Pottali Rasa is the main objective of this article. Material and Methods: Available literature related to Hemagarbha Pottali Rasa were searched from available printed form of Classics, and various text books, journals, web-based search engines source were referred for updated research data. Results: In Ayurvedic classics, various types of Hemagarbha pottali Rasa were mentioned and their method of preparation, contents, physical properties of different Pottalis are different. Therefore, Hemagarbh pottali Rasa is the most common Pottali described in

almost all classics, almost 36 references are available from various classical texts of *Rasashastra* in the name of *Hemagarbh Pottali Rasa*,. **Conclusion:** The specific technique were developed for potentiating the constituents and forming a complex with high therapeutic efficacy.

INTRODUCTION

Hemagarbha Pottali is metalo-minaral compound formulation first introduced by Yogaratnakar in 18th century AD.^[1], indicated for *Shwasa*, *Kasa*, *Kshaya*, *Vatavyadhi*, *Sannipataja Jwara & Sannipatajaavashtha*, *Rasayana*. Its therapeutic dose mentioned as 125mg/day.^[2] Hemagarbha Pottali Rasa is a milestone in history of *Ayurvedic* formulation emergency & critical care.^[3]

Hemagarbha Pottali Rasa is popular for its action in emergency conditions. But on finding a lot of references, even a single reference was not found which suggest it's utility in emergency condition, although the reference of "Rasamritam" suggest its action in Sannipataja condition, it may be correlated with emergency conditions. This reference also suggest one more important point "Anupanusaren Sarvrogeshu Yojyet" i.e. with different different vehicles (Anupana) Hemgarbha Pottali Rasa were used in different diseases i.e., one medicine can treat many diseases by changing the vehicle according to the diseases. So the reference of Rasamritam Rasayana Chikitsa Adhikara 218-222^[4] as review was undertaken for the study.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

To review on various *Hemagarbh Pottali Rasa* in Ayurvedic classics.

MATERIALS AND METHODS

Information and data related to *Hemagarbh Pottali Rasa* searched from available printed form literature, from various textbooks, journals, web-based search engines source and presented in systemic manner.

RESULT

Derivation of *Hema Garbha Pottali*

Hema Nirukti: 'Hinoti Vardhate Sphutati Veti. Hi+ manin'= Swarnam (Gold).

Garbha- Garbhyate Jeeva Sanjeeva Karma Phaladaatta.

That has everything essential and life giving.

Pottali: Pottali- Potena Sansleshena Leeyate Iti. Puttalika- Vastrabaddha Dravyam.

Pottali can mean to be concise, compact, minimize, make into a bundle or pocket of substances, or put different substances into a bundle or pocket; in the case of Pottali Kalpana, this means something similar.

Nomenclature of Hemagarbh Pottali Rasa

"Hemagarbh" means which contains Hem i.e Swarna it may be reason of calling Hemagarbha Pottali Rasa because it contains Swarna, but in all Hemagarbha Pottali Rasa Swarna is not added. Therefore, what could be other cause for calling it Hemagarbha Pottali Rasa. In "Amarkosh" A well-known Hindi dictionary Word "Hemagabh" means Tamra i.e. The Pottali which contains Tamra Bhasma as a main constituent is known as Hemagarbh Pottali. But in all Hemagarbh Pottali Tamra Bhasma is not ingredient as in Sharangdhar Samhita Madhyam Khand 12/97, and the Hemagarbh Pottali described in Yog Ratnakar Kasa Chikitsa Adikar 4th version does not contain Tamra. Therefore, there could be some other reasons for the nomenclature as Hemagarbh Pottali Rasa.

- 1) Hem could be a first element
- 2) Hem could be more in amount in comparison to other constituents
- 3) Hem could be more active /working constituent

First two reasons are not so applicable, so 3rd one is more suitable for making the nomenclature of *Hemagarbh Pottali*.

Various types of *Hemgarbha pottali Rasa*, were mentioned in Ayurvedic classics, and the method of preparation, contents, and the physical properties of different *Pottalis* are different. So as *Hemagarbh pottali Rasa* is the most common *Pottali* described in almost all classics, because of its efficacy it is the most popular *Pottali*, manufactured and used among all *Pottali* preprations. In the name of *Hemagarbh Pottali Rasa*, almost 36 references are available from various classical texts of *Rasashastra* in Table 1.

DISCUSSION

Hemagarbha Pottali Rasa is a Sagandha, Sagni, Gandhaka Jarita, Potta Bandha Pottali Kalpana containing Parada, Gandhaka, Swarna Bhasma, Tamra Bhasma processed with Mridvagni. It is explained by Acharya Yadavji Trikamji in Rasamritham^[15] it can be used in Kasa, Shwasa, Kshaya, Vatakapha, Grahani, Sarvaroga with Parnakhanda Swarasa or Madhu as Anupana. Parada having properties of Yogavahi, Rasayana, Vrishya, Balya, Vayastambhana, Pustikarak, Deepana, Agnivardhaka, Deha and Loha Siddhikara, Ropana, Krimighna and Tridoshagna Vyadhi Prabhava - Vata roga, Vali, Palithya, Jara roga, Sarva Akshi roga, Krimi, Kusta, Sarva roga. Sushruta Samhita has mentioned the properties of Swarna as Tridosahara, Visapaham, Brumhaniya etc. and specially indicated in children as Swarna Prashana.^[16] Hemagarbha Pottali has antimicrobial activity against all types of microbes/bacterial strain.^[17]

CONCLUSION

Sagni Sagandha Murchchana of Parada, along with other Dhatus, is Hemagarbha Pottali Rasa. Parada considered a Yogavahi. This drug is more effective at a lower dose because of Agnisanskara, prolonged heat of pattern, and media use for its Paka. Owing to the Yogavahi qualities of Parada and its ability to mixed with other drugs to intensify their effects, the drug is easy to take, even when taken by the tongue, and has a longer shelf life. More pharmaceutical companies ought to support the large-scale production of Pottali Rasayana as well as the meticulous documentation of quality control and standards.
