PREPARATION OF MULBERRY PIGMENT

The extraction method followed the previous research with few modification. Mulberry fruit was washed and clean with water and then sorted to remove the stalks and other impurities. The sorted sample was crushed with hand blender so that pulp was formed was macerated twice with a solvent (1: 3) which consisted of methanol and glacial acetic acid for 24 hours. The maceration process was done in ice bath and with minimum light exposure. The maceration product was filtered to obtain the filtrate

In order to remove the small particles filtrate is centrifuge on 4000 rpm for 5 mins.
