#### **ABSTRACT**

Ayurveda is the science of life, in which the main aim is prevention is better than cure. Shalakya Tantra is mentioned as Urdhavanga Chikitsa in Ashtanga Ayurveda. It deals with diseases related to the ear, nose, eye etc Urdhavajatrugata organs. Mukha is one of the important parts of our body as well as starting part of digestive system or Annavaha Strotas. Therefore, proper hygiene has to be maintained for Mukha or mouth. Mukhapaka is among the Mukharogas which is commonly found in ENT and general practice. It is formed due to the vitiation of Kapha Dosha at the site of mouth region. As per modern it can be correlated with Stomatitis or mouth ulcer. For the management of Mukharogas there are various treatments available in Ayurveda, like Gandusha, Kavala, Shamana Chikitsa. This all helps to reduce Sthanika Kapha Dosha dushti which gives relief. So therefore, here in this case study, Jatipatradi Kwatha Gandusha is used for the management of Mukhapaka.

#### INTRODUCTION

*Mukhapaka* is frequently found disease in daily practice. The mouth ulcers are curable but affects person's quality of life due to its negative impact. *Mukhapaka* affects activities like eating, swallowing, brushing etc.

In *Ayurvedic* texts *Mukhapaka* is described as *Sarvasara Roga* due to its spread in complete oral cavity.<sup>[3]</sup> It is developed due to the various infection, nutritional deficiency, hormonal imbalance, allergy, stress, etc. If *Mukhapaka* remains untreated it may developed oral candidiasis.

The causative factors responsible for every diseases are important, so that in *Ayurveda* for every disease line of treatment mentioned as '*Nidana Parivarjana*'.<sup>[4]</sup> *Mukhapaka* is mentioned under *Raktavaha Strotas Dushtajanya Vyadhi*.<sup>[5]</sup> So, while considering the disease *Mukhapaka* for the management, its causative factors *like Raktavaha Strotas Dushti Hetus* are also for its Pathogenesis formation.

Mouth ulcers are common complaints found in outdoor patients and its prevalence is 25% worldwide. [6] Many treatments like antibiotics, anti-inflammatory, Analgesics, supplements like vitamins etc. are given in modern science, which are limited or unsatisfactory.

Jatipatradi Kwatha Gandusha mentioned for the management of Mukhapaka in Bhaishajya Ratnawali Samhita. It contains Jatipatra, Amruta, Draksha, Javasa, Darvi, Triphala. This all drugs having Shothaghna, Shulaghna, Vrana Ropana, Vrana Shodhaka, Mukha Vaishadyakara etc properties. Therefore, for the present study Jatipatradi Kwatha Gandusha has been selected.

#### **Objectives of the study**

To assess the effect of *Jatipatradi Kwatha Gandusha* in the management of *Mukhapaka* w.s.r. to Stomatitis.

#### **MATERIALS AND METHODS**

#### **CASE STUDY**

A 28-year-old female patient visited in OPD of *Shalakya Tantra* department presenting with the complaints of *Vedana* [Pain in the mouth], *Shotha* [Inflammation], *Sadaha* [Burning sensation and *Raktata* [Redness] in the mouth since from 4-5 days.

#### **History of present illness**

Patient is normal before 5 days, then she developed *Vedana, Shotha* etc complaints in the mouth with burning sensation along with unable to open mouth, difficulty in swallowing, chewing etc. Therefore, for the relief patient comes to *Ayurveda* hospital.

Nadi = 74/min, Mala = Samyaka, Mutra = Samyaka, Jivha = Nirama, Shabda = Spashta, Sparsha = Sheeta, Druka = Prakruta, Aakruti = Madhyam.

Past history – No any H/O DM, HTN, etc.

**Family history** – No ant H/O Maternal, paternal history.

**Treatment history** – NAD

**Surgical history** – No history.

#### Management

*Jatipatradi Kwatha Gandusha* was used for the management of *Mukhapaka*. This Gandusha was given for about 7 days of case study. It was examined on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> days.

Jatipatradi Kwatha contains Jatipatra, Amruta, Javasa, Darvi, Draksha, Triphala. This all drugs helps to relief Vedana, Shotha, Daha, Mukha Vishodhana, Vrana Shodhana & Ropana properties.<sup>[7.8]</sup>

Jatipatradi Kwatha Gandusha helps to reduces Mukhapaka and its Vrana, Vedana etc complaints. In this case study, Jatipatradi Kwatha Gandusha was given for 7 days of study and it shows effective in the management of Mukhapaka.

#### DISCUSSION

Jatipatradi Kwatha Gandusha when taken in the form of drug administration of Gandusha in the oral cavity, the chemical constituents and active ingredients of Jatipatradi Kwatha absorbed through buccal mucosa and reach the blood stream. By increasing mechanical pressure in the oral cavity, stimulates salivary gland and helps to maintains PH. Jatipatradi Kwatha having actions like Shothaghna, Shulaghna, Mukha Vishodhana, Vranaghna, etc. which helps to reduces the Kapha dushti and heals Mukhapaka.

#### **CONCLUSION**

Jatipatradi Kwatha having actions like Vranaghna, Shulaghna, Shothaghna also it is safer, easy to use. In the 7 days of study, Jatipatradi Kwatha Gandusha has been shown significant effective in the management of Mukhapaka.
