SHARANGDHAR SAMHITA: A CRITICAL REVIEW

ABSTRACT

Ayurveda is an appendage of *Atharvaveda*. The knowledge of Ayurveda comes to us through many *Samhitas*. The word "Samhita" gives a sense of the antiquity and authenticity of Ayurveda. Ancient scholars have basically divided *Ayurvedic* literature into two parts: 1. *Brihatrayi* (*Charakasamhita*, *Sushrutasamhita* and *Asatangasangraha*). 2. *Laghutrayi:* (*Madhavanidan*, *Sharangdhar Samhita*, and *Bhavaprakash*). *Shargadharacharya* has collected most of the subject matter available in this *Samhita* from ancient texts like the *Charaka Samhita*, the *Sushruta Samhita*, and some other texts of *Rasashastra*.

INTRODUCTION

In the mediaeval period, Ayurveda had reached a fully efficient state. *Rasasastra* was also developing during that period. *Rasayana* and *Vajikaran* were at their peaks during that period. During that time, the principles of medicine were weakening. Then scholars started creating medical texts. As a result, *Sharangdhar Samhita* was formed. The *Shargadhar Samhita* is divided into *Purva Khand, Madhyam Khand,* and *Uttar Khand. Shargadhara Samhita* has 32 chapters and 2600 verses. But at present, the complete 2600 verses are not available. The commentators *Shri Aadhamalla* and *Kashiram Vaidya* wrote commentaries on only 2325 verses.

TIKAKAR AND BOOK

The author of this book was *Acharya Shargadhar*. Many commentaries have been written on the *Shargadhara Samhita*. The first Sanskrit commentary *'Deepika'* was written by *Sri Aadhamalla* in the 12th century. Among other Sanskrit Tikas, *Shri Bopdev* wrote *'Gudharthadeepika'*, *Shargadhara* wrote *'Sharir Tika'*, *Pt. Kashiramji* wrote *'GudharthaDeepika'* and *Sri Rudrata Bhatta* wrote *'Ayurveddeepika'*. *Shri Baijnath Saraswat* wrote *'Shargadhar-Sudhakar'* and *'Subodhini'* by *Pt. Prayagdutt Sharma* and many other commentators wrote *Tikas* in Hindi.

PURVA KHAND

There are 7 chapters in this section. In the 1st chapter, invocation, importance of the book, medical instructions, calculation of chapters and verses of all three volumes, description of different values, description of new and ancient substances, description of dry and wet substances, animal material intake method, description of red and white sandalwood, description of inferiority in powder, proper and inappropriate substances, medicine substances based on location, the method of taking substances, the condemned drug substances, drug collection based on seasonal differences, and the reception of substance ingredients have all been described.

In the 2nd chapter, the duration of drug intake, the five states of matter, the characteristics of the substance, the 6 distinctions and symptoms of the *Rasa*, the order of origin of the *Rasa*, the qualities of the *Panchmahabhuta*, the qualities of the *Gurvadi Guna*, the description of *Virya*, the description of the *Vipaka*, the description of the *Prabhav*, Actions of *Rasa*, description of *Doshas* due to difference of seasons, description of seasons according to zodiac signs, seasons sequence for *Shodhana* and *Sanchaya – Prakopa - shamana kal* of *Doshas* have been described.

In the 3rd chapter, pulse examination, pulse movements, eye examination, tongue test, urine test, symptoms of a medically fit patient, symptom of a doctor, symptom of an attendant, symptom of medicine, four parts of therapy, nightmares and good dreams have been described.

In the 4th chapter, symptoms of *Dipan, Pachan, Shaman, Anuloman, Stransana*, penetration, catharsis, vomiting, purification, piercing, *Lekhan, Grahi, Stambhan, Rasayan, Vajikaran, Shukral, Sukshma, Vayavayi, Vikasi*, intoxicating substances, *Visha, Pramathi, Abhishyandi*,

Vidahi, Lnghan, Brihan, Rukshan, Snehan, Swedan, Slakshna, Sthir, Sar, Pichhil, Vishad, Sthool, fluid, Concentrated, Tikshna, Mand and Mridu substances have been described.

In the 5th chapter, body, *Kala, Aashay, Dhatu* and *Updhatu* are described. Type of skin and their name are also described in this chapter. Description of *Dosha* have been mentioned. Introduction of *Sandhi*, bone, *Marma, Sira, Dhamani*, muscles, ligaments, *Randhra, Mal, Strotas, Jaal, Kurch, Rajju, Sevani, Sanghaat*, Seemant, togue, heart, lungs, spleen, liver, pancreas, kidney, testis, penis and uterus have been also described in this chapter. Type of body nourishment and body nourishment through *Pranavayu*, defination of life and death, importance of *Roganivriti*, importance of treatment, direction for disease prevention, importance of *Samdosha* and definition of healthy have been described. *Srishtikrama*, *Buddhi*, senses, *Panchtanmatra*, *Prakriti*, *Vikriti* and *Aatma* have been mentioned. Symptoms of *Moh, Ahankar, Kaam, Krodha, Lobha* and *Rogarogya* have been also described in this chapter.
