AYURVEDIC AND MODERN ASPECT OF YONIKANDA – A REVIEW

ABSTRACT

Now a day's stressful lifestyle and improper food habbits affecting the health of women which causing various gynaecological disorders. In Ayurveda which are mentioned as 20 *yonivyapadas*. Apart from this 20 *Yonivyapadas* some other diseases also mentioned in samhitas such as *Yonikanda*. *Yonikanda* is a disease of vulva or lower vaginal canal having round or irregular shape due to injury by nails or teeth or other causative factors. It has 4 types as *vataja*, *pittaja*, *kaphaja* & *sannipataja*. In modern it is difficult to correlate with any disease. But with the resemblance of sign and symptoms we can correlate it with Bartholin's abscess. It is due to obstruction of bartholin's duct by fibrosis that cause exudates pent up inside and cause abcess.

INTRODUCTION

Women's health is important as a healthy women makes healthy family.

Now a day's stressful lifestyle & improper food habits affecting the health of women which causing various gynaecological disorders. In Ayurveda classics majority of gynaecological disorders mentioned under the word *Yonivyapadas*. Aparts from this 20 *Yonivyapadas* in *Laghutrayi* and Yogratnakar Mentioned about Yonikanda roga. *Yonikanda* 1st mentioned in Madhav nidan samhita. It is a disease of vulva or lower vaginal canal having round & irregular shape. It can be correlated with bartholin abscess because of presence of pus & blood. Bartholin's gland are situated in superficial perineal pouch, close to posterior end of vestibular bulb. They are Pea sized & 0.5 cm, each gland having duct. If this ducts gets

blocked by fibrosis and the exudates pent up inside to produce abscess. If it left uncared it may burst through lower vaginal wall.^[3]

MATERIAL AND METHODS

Literature review was done from various classical texts, modern books, Research articles, websites & Publications.

DISCUSSION

Yonikanda definition - Yonikanda is a disease of vulva or lower vaginal canal has round or irregular shape.

Nidan (Causes)

Nidan of yonikanda includes.

- Day-sleeping दिवास्वप्न
- Excessive anger अतिक्रोध
- Excessive excercise -अतिव्यायाम
- Excessive coitus अतिमैथ्न
- Ulceration by nails, teeth or thorns नखदन्तक्षत.

Samprapti (Pathogenesis)

Due to above causes dosha (Vata, Pitta, Kapha) aggravated due to their respective causes produce a kanda resemble to Nikuch or Lakuch fruit (Rounded or irregular shape fruit) also resemble to the colour of pus (Yellowish) or blood (Red) with pus discharge.^[4]

Prakara^[5]

- 4 types of *Yonikanda* mentioned by Aacharya Sharangdhar.
- 1. Vataja Yonikanda It is dry or rough, discoloured with cracked appearance.
- 2. Pittaja yonikanda This is with burning sensation, Redness and Fever.

- 3. *Kaphaja yonikanda* This Yonikanda having color of Nil pushpa (Atasi pushpa) or tilapushpa associated with itching.
- 4. *Sannipatika yonikanda* It is associated with features of all *doshas*.

Chikitsa^[6]

- 1. *Yonipurana Gairik* (Powder of red ochre), *Amrasthi* (kernel of mango), *Jantughna*, *Rajani*, *Anjan*, *Katphala churna* mixed with Honey.
- 2. *Yoniparisheka Triphala kwath* and honey.
- 3. Yonipichu Mushak tail.

Modern aspect of yonikanda

Bartholin's abscess^[7]

Bartholin's abscess is the end result of acute bartholinitis. The ducts gets blocked by Fibrosis and the exudates pent up inside to produce abscess. If it left untreated abscess may burst through lower veginal wall.

Clinical features

- Local pain and discomfort become intense
- Fever
- Pt connot walk or sit
- Overlying skin become red & edematous.
- On Examination- There is an unilateral tender swelling beneath the posterior half of the labium majus extending to medially to to the posterior Part of the labium minus.

Treatment

- Rest
- Analgesics For Pain relief
- Sitz bath
- Antibiotics Ampicillin 500 mg orally 8 hourly or Tetracycline in chlamydial infection.
- Abscess should be drained before it burst spontaneously.

CONCLUSION

Yonikanda is a disease of vulva or lower vaginal canal having round or irregular shape due to injury by nails or teeth or other causative factor. It is difficult to correlate exactly with modern disease. But it's resemblance with pus and blood (*Puyashonitasankash*) we can

correlate it with bartholin's abscess. It can be managed through ayurvedic treatment which is given in samhitas.
