EFFECT OF APAMARGA PRATISARANEEYA KSHARA ON NASAL POLYP-CASE STUDY

ABSTRACT

Nasal Polyps are fleshy non-cancerous transparent growth that occurs inside the nasal cavity and along the sinuses. They are mainly linked to the allergies or asthma. Larger polyps can even block normal drainage from sinuses. In Ayurveda It may be correlated to *Nasaarsha*, and its formed due to aggravated *Doshas* and gets lodged in *Nasa*, which vitiates *Twak*, *Mamsa* and *Meda*, which leads to 4 types of *Nasaarshas* (*Vataja*, *Pittaja*, *Kaphaja and Sannipataja*) It can be managed by *Aushada*, *Kshara*, *Agni and Shastra karma*. In the nasal polyp medical treatment has the limitations. So, A parasurgical procedure which is explained in *Shaastra* is *Ksharakarma* is opted here. Inspite of its *Soumya Guna Kshara* will do *Pachana*, *Vilayana*, *Shodana* and *Ropana* and of its *kshanana* and *Ksharana* actions can cure the *Arshas*. Hence here is a clinical trial done on a case of nasal polyp by *Kshara*, treatment was effective and no recurrence was noticed in the follow up.

INTRODUCTION

Nasa is the important organ of *urdhvajatru* and it is the gateway of cranial cavity as well as respiratory system. *Nasaarshas* is one among the 31 *Nasagata rogas*^[1] mentioned in our classics. *Nasaarshas* can be correlated to Nasal polyp. Prolonged use of antihistamines and antibiotics leads to drug resistance and decreases immunity. Nasal decongestants bring about rebound congestion. Fear of Surgery, its Complications and cost have restricted many patients from undergoing surgery.

In Ayurveda, *Kshara karma* plays an important role. It is one among the *Anushastra karma's*^[2] (Para surgical procedure) which is explained under *Upayantras*, *Anushastra* and *Shasti upakrama* aswell.

Acharya Sushrutha has quoted this *Kshara karma* as *Pradhanatama* while compared to *Shastra* and *Anushastra*.^[3] In present era, it plays very important role in Ayurvedic surgery and it is modified in different form based on the use such as *Pratisaraneeya kshara*, *Paneeya kshara*, *Kshara sutra*, *Kshara pichu* and *Kshara varti etc*.

Acharya Sushrutha emphasize on the practice of *Kshara karma* with cautions that when it is administered by an ignorant physician, it may harm the body like *Agni* (fire), *Shastra* (Weapon) and *Vajra* and can cause the death.^[4] But if same *Kshara* is applied by skilled and experienced *Vaidya*, it can subside the various illness. Though Acharya Sushrutha has given various options to treat *Arshas* like *Bheshaja*, *Kshara*, *Agni* and *Shastra* which is common treatment of *Nasaarsha* in general.^[5] Among them *Kshara* is best *Anushastra* to treat *Arsha*.^[6] Considering all these, *Kshara karma* is said to be effective in treating *Nasaarshas*. In this case the *Pratisaraneeya kashara karma* is done in *Nasaarshas* w.s.r to Nasal polyp.

AIM OF THE STUDY

• To find out the brief action of *Pratisaraneeya Kshara* in nasal polyp

METHODOLGY

Treatment given

Apamarga Prathisaraneeya Ksharakarma was done under local anesthesia in a single sitting. Post operatively internal medications was given.

Poorvakarma- Collection of material required for procedure such as *Kshara*, Nasal speculum, Artery forceps, Spatula, kidney tray, Lignocaine 10% spray, *Nimbu swarasa*, Cotton balls.

Informed consent was taken

Pradhana karma- Area is properly illuminated and draped. Polyp is exposed with the help of nasal speculum and secretions over the polyp were wiped out with cotton balls. Lignocaine 10% spray was sprayed into the required nostril for anaesthetic effect.

Lekhana karma was done over the polyp with probe to attain hyperaemia in that area. The Apamarga prathisaraneeya Kshara was applied over the polyp and waited for hundred Matrakala, and it was washed with Nimbu Swarasa and distilled water.

Paschath Karma-Advised the patient to avoid exposure to direct sunlight, dust, breeze, cold and avoid head bath for a day.

Followup after 7days.

Discussion on kshara

Kshara is an Anushastra karma, in the management of Arsha as it has Lekhana, Chedana and Bedana Tridoshaghna, Teekshna and Ushna property. In Nasarsha the Dosha predominance is Kaphapradhana Tridosha and Dushya is Mamsa as the Kshara has above said property it can reduce the vitiated Mamsa.

Discussion on nasal polyp

Nasa arsha is one of the major surgical disease in nasal disorders. Nasa Arsha has been mentioned by Acharya Sushruta and Vagbhata in which they have clearly mentioned about the Lakshanas like difficulty in breathing, therefore patient breathes from mouth, fluid discharge from the nose, constant sneezing, nasal voice, bad smell in the nose and headache are the common symptoms. Ayurvedic line of management can be considered to be easy and more effective. There will be no recurrence of disease where Kshara karma is done. Predominant lakshanas such as Srava, Shotha and Jalabahulyata indicates predominance of Kapha dosha. This indicates the Kapha dosha prabalata, along with Alpa pitta and VataKapha and Jalabahulyata is seen in samprapti which indicates to bring about Apatarpana and Rukshana. For the reversal of pathology and because of the chronicity in the

case, Pratisaraneeya kshara was chosen for Shodhana purpose without aggravating other doshas.

Mode of action of kshara on nasal mucosa

Chedana, Bhedana and Lekhana properties of Kshara cures the disease. Though first it produces the *kshata* (Injury or wound), later it gives relief (*Akshata*).

CONCLUSION

Nasal Polyp can be correlated to Nasaarsha depending upon its lakshanas. In Nasaarsha, Mamsa, Medo dhatu vitiates and because of the lekhana action of kshara karma, the polyp mass shrinks out. Hence it can be concluded that Apamarga kshara in the form of Pratisarana can be considered as an effective method for treating Nasa arshas. There was no side effects or adverse effects shown After treatment. Ayurvedic management has been found to be very effective in this case by following proper *Pathya*.
